Special report from the Chairman

After eight years at Fynn Valley the time has come to move on. When we came to FV in 2012 it was felt expedient by both clubs to have an open ended arrangement whereby either party could terminate the tenancy with 12 months' notice. Then in 2018 discussions took place about a more permanent agreement in the form of a 25 year lease. Unfortunately the terms required by FV would have meant a considerable increase in our costs which was felt to be unsustainable.

Furthermore our current location, at the end of the driving range with the hazard of flying golf balls, was seen as temporary and in phase 2 of the golf club's remodelling we would be moved to a safer and more permanent site. This second move would involve us in constructing new lawns at significant cost which we planned to meet with the help of a Croquet Association grant.

Now Fynn Valley wishes to implement phase 2 and take back the area we currently occupy. However a suitable alternative has not been found. Also with no security of tenure neither club is keen to invest in new lawn construction.

The upshot is Fynn Valley has asked us to find a new home and has given us 18 months in which to do so. This allows us one more season at Fynn Valley after the current one ends. Both parties are keen that there should be no animosity.

Your committee is taking a positive attitude. A new home presents an opportunity to get better security of tenure and the ability to develop better quality lawns. I wish to assure you that we have no intention to shut up shop, and we are wasting no time in preparing the necessary Business Plan, Accounts and Presentations for potential landlords and financiers while compiling lists of potential landowners – public and private.

If you are able to help or know of any possible site please let me know. I would however urge that no direct action is taken without first consulting me. It is imperative that we are fully prepared and all singing from the same song sheet.

I will keep you informed of progress on a regular basis. In the meantime should you have any questions or suggestions please don't hesitate to contact me.

I am looking forward to a bright new future for ICC.
