Trinity Park Update

Wednesday, 17th August 2022 was the day we had all been waiting for. The day when at last work started on the construction of our new croquet facility at Trinity Park.



The morning was hot and dry and the contractors faced dessert like conditions. The 'field top maker', the machine which planes off all existing organic matter, created a veritable dust storm into which for a while the collecting vehicles completely disappeared.

Then, much to the relief of all, the skies opened, the dust settled and everyone was refreshed albeit very wet.

The clearing work continued on Thursday. Then on Friday and Monday the top soil was loosened to allow any rain to soak in and make life easier for the levelling process which is scheduled to start week commencing 5th September.

From the footprints in the newly exposed sandy soil it became apparent that the rabbits were having a grand time.

So while we wait for the laser grader to start levelling, the contractors will make a start on the rabbit fencing. This 300 metre long fence will surround the entire playing area and hopefully keep the little beggars out. *(Continued)*



Moving the pavilion

Our Trinity Park contractors do not want the pavilion on site until the ground has been levelled. However as soon as levelling is complete the pavilion will be moved.

At that stage we will need volunteers to dismantle it (some have already signed up), load it onto the transporter at Fynn Valley and unload at Trinity Park. Trinity Park has generously offered to provide the transport saving us a considerable expense.

Further help will then be needed to re-assemble and repair the pavilion—a new roof is almost inevitable. We will be in touch with all members when dates are known. In the main the help needed will be for lifting and carrying—a bit at a time for most of us—and to provide tea and refreshments for the labourers.

Help going forward

A new facility with 4 quality lawns means that our membership capacity and ability to host more tournaments, matches and events will be greatly increased. In turn this means more work for the committee and its supporters.

Advantage Golf Croquet

For some time now, the Crochet Association has had serious concerns about Golf Croquet handicap play. The system of free turns changes the strategy of the game. How free turns are used can becomes more important than the tactics and skilled shot making that form the very basis of Golf Croquet. In effect Handicap Golf Croquet can become an entirely different game to that of level play.

Advantage Golf Croquet is the CA's answer. The CA's intention is to eventually replace the free turn system altogether. Trials of Advantage play started some 2 years ago and, although clubs have been slow to take it up, it is likely in the foreseeable future to become the only handicap system for interclub matches.

So what is Advantage Golf Croquet?

Well to start there are no free turns. As with the old handicap system each hoop run scores 1 point and the game is won by the first player to score 7. However in Advantage play each player has a starting score based on their index (handicap). Therefore the number of hoops each player has to run to reach a score of 7 and win the game is not necessarily the same.

As already mentioned the starting score is determined by a players handicap. A chart, similar in style to the one used to calculate points won in level play, determines each player's starting score.

For example the chart shows that if a 10 handicapper plays a 5 handicapper, the 10 handicapper has a starting score of +1 (this means this player needs to only run 6 hoops to reach a score of 7 and win), and the 5 handicapper has a starting score of -2 (this means he/she has to run 9 hoops to reach a score of 7 and win).

In doubles the handicaps of both players in each team are added together and then halved.

Clearly the club needs to trial Advantage GC before jumping to conclusions. Perhaps with the consent of all players on the day we should trial Advantage at one of our forthcoming in-house tournaments.
